## Position Information

This is an opportunity for:

- An internal candidate to fill a GS-14 cadre position.
- A Federal Government employee to serve on a two-year reimbursable detail assignment in the ODNI. The detail assignment may be extended an additional year if all parties agree.

## Who May Apply

Current GS employees at the same grade or one grade lower than the advertised position grade may apply.

Former members of the Peace Corps may be considered for ODNI employment only if five full years have elapsed since separation from the Peace Corps.

- For a cadre assignment:
  - Current ODNI cadre.



- Current ODNI Staff Reserve Employees. (A staff reserve employee who currently occupies this position may not apply.)
- For a detailee assignment:
  - Current Federal Government employees.

## **Salary Determination**

- The ODNI uses a rank-in-person system in which rank is attached to the individual. A selected ODNI candidate or other Federal Government candidate will be assigned to the position at the employee's current GS grade and salary.
- A current Federal Government employee, selected for a detail, will be assigned to the position at his or her current grade and salary.

## **Component Mission**

The mission of the National Counterintelligence & Security Center is to lead and support the counterintelligence and security activities of the US Government, the US Intelligence Community, and US private sector entities who are at risk of intelligence collection, penetration or attack by foreign and other adversaries.

## **Major Duties and Responsibilities (MDRs)**

- Serve as the principal counterintelligence advisor to the Director of NCSC and the National Intelligence Manager/National Intelligence Officer for Space and Technical Intelligence (NIM/NIO S&TI) on foreign technical intelligence issues, including foreign intelligence threats to US space systems.
- Lead and guide IC analysis, collection, and counterintelligence initiatives to address priority intelligence gaps and counter foreign intelligence threats to US space systems and technology research and development base; enhance NIM/NIO S&TI, NCSC, and IC and policy community clients' understanding of foreign intelligence entities' plans, intentions, capabilities, tradecraft, and operations to target US space systems and high priority technologies; and support the development of solutions to address CI resource and capability needs for the space and technical intelligence domains. Support other NCSC components and IC agencies as applicable to include CI campaigns.
- Collaborate with the Space Intelligence Group, the Weapon and Space Systems Intelligence Committee, and other foreign space intelligence entities to advance NIM S&TI's Unifying Intelligence Strategy and make effective use of IC resources to identify and counter foreign intelligence threats to US space and technical intelligence capabilities.
- Collaborate with NCSC on the implementation of the National CI strategy/Roadmap, CI mission reviews, and evaluation of key gaps; advance the mission objectives of the NCSC National CI Strategy and DNI's National Intelligence Strategy.



- Initiate, cultivate, and maintain productive working relationships with colleagues, experts, IC members, policy committees, and law enforcement agencies as appropriate and use these relationships to share information of interest; attend internal and external training, seminars, or conferences on space and technical intelligence issues.
- Develop and continually expand personal knowledge in counterintelligence and achieve a government-wide reputation as a force for integration.

## **Mandatory and Educational Requirements**

- Expert knowledge of IC analysis and collection sufficient to lead space counterintelligence (CI) initiatives and identify CI-related analytic and collection requirements and gaps.
- Expert knowledge of and experience in the intelligence cycle.
- Excellent written, oral communication, and critical thinking skills, as demonstrated by the ability to articulate complex issues to a wide audience and develop products for senior USG officials.
- Excellent interpersonal, organizational, and problem-solving skills; ability to build and leverage professional networks; and, ability to work effectively both independently and in a team/collaborative environment.
- Ability to handle taskings, assess and manage performance, and collaborate on goal setting.

## **Desired Requirements**

- Knowledge of space technology and technical intelligence issues and/or experience working with the IC's space analytic community.
- Previous intelligence mission management experience.
- Previous counterintelligence experience.
- One year equivalent to at least next lower grade level in the normal line of progression.
- Bachelor's degree or equivalent experience in mission specialty area.

**Applicants from federal agencies outside the IC** must provide:

- a. **WRITTEN ENDORSEMENT** from the employing agency concurring with the detail.
- b. **RESUME:** Applicants are encouraged to carefully review the vacancy announcement, particularly the MDRs, and construct their resume to highlight their most significant experience and qualifications relevant to this job opportunity.
- c. **PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS:** Applicants are required to provide their two most recent performance evaluations. A justification is required if the applicant is unable to provide the two most recent evaluations.
