Position Information

This is an opportunity for:

- An internal candidate to fill a GS-15 cadre position.
- A Federal Government employee to serve on a two-year reimbursable detail assignment in the ODNI. The detail assignment may be extended an additional year if all parties agree.

Who May Apply

Current GS employees at the same grade as or one grade below than the advertised position grade may apply.

Former members of the Peace Corps may be considered for ODNI employment only if five full years have elapsed since separation from the Peace Corps.

- For a cadre assignment:
 - Current ODNI permanent cadre.
- For a detailee assignment:
 - Current Federal Government employees. (Current GS employees at the same grade as or one grade below than the advertised position grade may apply.)



Salary Determination

- The ODNI uses a rank-in-person system in which rank is attached to the individual. A selected ODNI candidate or other Federal Government candidate will be assigned to the position at the employee's current GS grade and salary.
- A current Federal Government employee, selected for a detail, will be assigned to the position at his or her current grade and salary.
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Component Mission

The Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) Deputy Director of Mission Integration (MI) serves as the Director of National Intelligence's (DNI) senior leader for intelligence integration across the IC enterprise. MI is responsible for ensuring customer outcomes by leading advances in collection and analysis that ensure the quality, timeliness, and utility of insights for the nation's decision-makers. Additionally, MI is responsible for increasing expertise and improving tradecraft at all levels through specialization, integration, and collaboration. MI is responsible for the strategic vision, direction, and planning to deliver a more integrated IC reflecting the collective wisdom of our collection and analytic components to advance, in support of the National Intelligence Managers, the Unifying Intelligence Strategies (UIS).

Major Duties and Responsibilities (MDRs)

Responsible for standing up and leading a new group within the Performance Assessments Division focused on assessing the effectiveness, contributions, and value of various intelligence capabilities in specific USG missions.

Forms and leads combined IC, ODNI, and interagency government/contractor teams in designing and conducting data-driven assessments of IC intelligence capabilities for the purposes of:

- Uncovering and triaging the root causes of intelligence gaps and coverage quality issues;
- Determining the contributions and relative value of intelligence capabilities to customer mission needs, and;
- Recommending changes to intelligence capability or capacity to improve or optimize intelligence contributions to customer mission sets.

Designs, coordinates, and gains approval for tailored assessment methodologies, terms of reference, and inter-agency agreements necessary for responding to government requirements for assessments;

Trains and leads teams in the execution of expeditionary, data-driven intelligence capability assessments, including customer and stakeholder engagement, hypothesis development & testing, data and analytics development, visualization products, and executive (DEXCOM level) presentation of findings and recommendations.

Creates and sustains partnerships with other IC elements.

Mandatory and Educational Requirements

IC experience demonstrating broad and deep insight into the IC's structure, roles and responsibilities, and intelligence capabilities;

Demonstrated in-depth domain experience in one or more intelligence disciplines (HUMINT, SIGINT, GEOINT, MASINT, OSINT or all-source analysis);

Demonstrated experience leading teams in designing and executing IC studies, assessments, or evaluations;

Desired Requirements

Knowledge, skills, and experience in applied statistics, operations research, artificial intelligence/machine learning, or advanced data-driven management consulting.



Demonstrated ability to collaborate and innovate to solve problems.

Ability to travel, CONUS and OCONUS, to conduct assessments in IC and customer operational locations.

Applicants from federal agencies outside the IC Applying for a Detail Assignment:
